The Hotel Wayne, originally constructed in 1827, was rebuilt in 1892 and maintained since then as an elegant, small town, country hotel. The ground floor has a large lounge, two dining rooms and an impressive entrance lobby with a classical staircase. The main dining room has beautiful original brick walls and twelve foot high tin ceilings. On the second and third floors the Hotel has twenty individual rooms and suites, each with private bath, and decorated with the comfort of our guests in mind. Each room has a computerized direct dial telephone system, color cable TV, is fully air conditioned and has Super High Speed Free Internet throughout the Hotel.

The Hotel is situated in Honesdale Borough which, in addition to being the county seat, is the center of commerce in Wayne County. Our county has a rich past - from the latter half of the 1700's when settlers from Connecticut began clearing the woods to 1825 when the county seat was renamed Honesdale after Philip Hone, who at one time was the Mayor of New York City. Honesdale, via a canal built by the D & O Canal Company to the Delaware River, was the main port for delivery of Pennsylvania coal to the New York City. Indeed, the first commercial steam locomotive operating in the U.S., the Stourbridge Lion, began operating from Honesdale in 1829. Wayne County continues to maintain the rich traditional values of country life to this day.

Wayne County has an abundance of recreational activities. There are over 500 lakes, many of which have state-owned public access areas, and boat ramps.

Among these is Lake Wallenpaupack, which at 5,700 acres, is the largest lake in Pennsylvania. There are over 20,000 acres of state managed lands which are open on a year round basis for hiking, picnicking, camping, hunting, cross country skiing and sightseeing. Some of these areas in the northern and western parts of the county are so lightly used, one can truly get away from it all.

Wayne County also provides numerous sports activities, with particular emphasis on golf and horseback riding. In the immediate vicinity of Honesdale, there are four excellent golf courses with generally no waiting time. Other interesting activities include railroad excursions on restored trains along the route of the old D & O Canal, as well as the opportunity to search for antiques and other bargains among the numerous antique shops, flea markets and old fashioned country auctions. As a site for new and relocating business, Wayne County can provide very low building, development and operating costs, along with low energy costs and an abundant skilled and ready labor pool.

The Hotel is home to Bistro 1202, our restaurant serving classical American cuisine offering creative and innovative dishes based on traditional American foods.
